Sessions in clinical categories will center on stroke community risk factors; emergency care; acute neuroimaging; acute endovascular and acute nonendovascular treatment; diagnosis of stroke etiology; cerebral large artery disease; in-hospital treatment; clinical rehabilitation and recovery; and outcomes, quality and health services research. Sessions in basic science categories focus on vascular biology in health and disease; basic and preclinical neuroscience of stroke recovery; and experimental mechanisms and models. Further specialized topics include pediatric stroke; intracerebral hemorrhage; nursing; preventive strategies; vascular cognitive impairment; aneurysm; subarachnoid hemorrhage and other neurocritical management; vascular malformations; and ongoing clinical trials.

In addition to exceptional education and networking with more than 4,000 cerebrovascular research and practice experts from around the globe, you will also have the chance to experience Nashville, Tennessee – nicknamed "Music City" for good reason! Long known as the "Songwriting Capital of the World," music weaves a fundamental pattern in Nashville's cultural, business and social fabric, and live music can be seen and heard every day and night of the week. 



Domestic Attendance vs. International Attendance 2014


