The Dr. Nanette K. Wenger Research Goes Red® Award recognizes the best article on cardiovascular disease and stroke in women published each year in an American Heart Association journal. Beginning in 2021 at American Heart Association Scientific Sessions, the award provides a cash prize and plaque to the winner. The corresponding author will receive the award on behalf of the co-authors and will present the winning article at Scientific Sessions.

9:45-11 a.m. | *Main Event II* Valve-tastic! What's the Latest and Greatest in Lifetime Management, Imaging, Science and Technology in Valvular Heart Disease

This session will give a high-level overview for cutting-edge developments in valvular heart disease examining lifetime management of aortic valve disease, multimodality management of mitral valve disease, new imaging insights, what's hot in basic and translational science, and what's next in technology and clinical trials.

1:30-2:45 p.m. | *Main Event II* Eliminating Health Inequity in Cardiovascular Disease

There have been long-standing and persistent racial and ethnic disparities in cardiovascular disease and stroke mortality. Globally, the largest decrease in life expectancy during the COVID-19 pandemic was observed in the U.S., with Blacks and Hispanics having the greatest decrease. Since the 1980s, there has also been widening disparities in cardiovascular disease mortality, stroke mortality and maternal mortality in rural counties versus urban counties. This main event session will focus on the medical community's role in moving health equity and social justice forward, research innovations and data-driven interventions to eliminate health disparities, diversifying the health care workforce, improving both urban and rural health and funding priorities.

3:15-4:30 p.m. | *Main Event II* Cardiac Arrest on the Athletic Field: A Team Approach

This session will focus on cardiac arrest on the athletic field, addressing various aspects such as common and uncommon causes, emergency preparedness, athletic screening and return to play following such an event. The session will also explore the differentiation between athlete heart and cardiomyopathy as well as the role of myocardial inflammation on SCD during athletic participation. The highlight of the session will include athletes who survived SCD on the field to provide their perspectives on life after death and experiences with attempting to return to sports.

The polypill concept for cardiovascular disease prevention and treatment was first advanced over 20 years ago. Since that time, proof-of-concept studies have demonstrated improvement in cardiovascular disease risk factors leading to recent large randomized trials showing improved clinical outcomes with the fixed-dose combination therapies. The WHO in 2023 added fixed-dose combination medications for prevention of atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease to the list of Essential Medicines.

A multidisciplinary group of speakers will discuss the underlying pathophysiology, optimal pharmacotherapeutic strategies, approaches for interdisciplinary preventative care and management, considerations for prediction beyond the outcome of ASCVD and implications for health equity.

Dr. White was also one of the founding fathers of the American Heart Association and a past president. The first lecture was presented in 1967. In 1987, at the request of the Committee on Scientific Sessions Program, the Steering Committee on Medical and Community Programs renamed the lecture "The Paul Dudley White International Lecture."

8-9:15 a.m. | *Main Event II* AI in the Clinic and Lab: Promise, Pitfalls and the Data Police

This is a not-to-be-missed session at the clinicaltranslational interface. It has high relevance to clinicians, researchers and patients with varying levels of interest and expertise related to how we leverage emerging data opportunities to enhance cardiovascular health and disease. We start with a primer on AI in cardiovascular care — how does it work, what data does it require, and what's already being done in this space to impact cardiovascular care. Next, we examine use cases for how AI can address our clinical biases and blind spots. This is followed by a reality check from the "data police" methodologists highlighting the pitfalls, potential biases generated from AI and how AI has the potential for real harm. This is followed by another reality check on the need for precision in our scientific and clinical approaches when we think about training, validation and application of AI-based models across scientific and clinical contexts.

This session will address cardiovascular aging at the epidemiologic, patient and molecular levels. The speakers will span the gamut of population-level insights to molecular details underpinning aging in the cardiovascular system. This marquee session will conclude with a panel discussion to identify the next steps in the field of cardiovascular aging.

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
